### What is the CMB Programme?

The CMB Programme is funded through the Rural Development Programme for England and is an area based regeneration programme which focuses on developing activities in rural areas of Stafford Borough and Staffordshire Moorlands.

### Who can it support and where?

The Us2 project runs until 2012 and is funded through the CMB programme, the project has appointed Youth Workers to support your community to provide activities for young people giving them a chance to try something new and develop their social, physical, mental and spiritual needs.

### How will it work?

Young people will be given opportunities through the programme that will help them to form meaningful relationships both in and outside the community.
